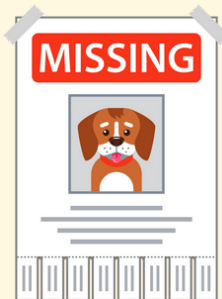
## SNIFFLES, SCRATCHING, AND SPRINGTIME WOES?
